





Fatalities Are Down






As of 1/21/2024

- These numbers are preliminary and pending trauma and investigative outcomes.
- Preliminary data implies lowest year on record (since 1947); previous low is 350 fatalities in 2013.
- Fatality monitoring through mid-January indicates 2025 is currently higher than the same week in 2024, but lower than 2022 and 2023.



Fatalities & Injuries


- 8% decrease in total crashes since 2018
 - Down: fatality, possible injury, property damage only
 - Up: serious injury, minor injury
- 4% increase in crash costs




Serious Injuries

- Increase in serious injuries is more pronounced on local system and urban roads.
- For crashes involving a fatality or injury, crash costs on state system and rural roads have essentially stayed flat.



Strategy Teams' Objectives











Safer People

 Encourage safe, responsible driving and behavior by people who use our roads and create conditions that prioritize their ability to reach their destination unharmed.

Safer Vehicles

 Expand the availability of vehicle systems and features that help to prevent crashes and minimize the impact of crashes on both occupants and non-occupants.

Safer Roads

 Design roadway environments to mitigate human mistakes and account for injury tolerances, to encourage safer behaviors, and to facilitate safe travel by the most vulnerable road users.

Safer Speeds

 Promote safer speeds in all roadway environments through a combination of thoughtful, equitable, context-appropriate roadway design, targeted education, outreach campaigns, and enforcement.

Post-Crash Care

 Enhance the survivability of crashes through expedient access to emergency medical care, while creating a safe working environment for vital first responders and preventing secondary crashes through robust traffic incident management practices.



I-135 Corridor


- South Central KS (Sedgwick & Harvey Counties)

- Cherokee/Crawford county line north to US-69/US-160 junction




Local Safety Plans & Coalitions
